days.
Chapter Eight
1. After 150 days of waters covering the entire earth, God caused a to pass over

2. The waters receded continually for a period, and eventually the ark rested on the

9. In verse 20, we see the mention of worship after the creation of human life:

10. Noah built an to God upon them leaving the ark. Why? It's most likely that
God had given instruction to Noah concerning worship. He built an altar to make
to God; perhaps, this is why God had him to bring in the ark, more
animals than animals.
11. The sacrifice or worship was to God, that is, God accepted it; God then
made a (a promised) that "I will never again the ground for man's
sake."
12. In <b>verse 21</b> , God says that man's " <b>heart is evil from his</b> ," not from birth or
as a baby, and there's a difference. This may imply that we become for our
sins in our youth or young age.
13. Does verse 21 imply that God will never destroy life again? No! For God will destroy
the earth again in His final, see 2 Peter 3:10ff.
