FROM PAPER TO PRACTICE (Let's Keep The Momentum Going In Our Growing In The "One Anothers"!!

Someone has said that "repetition is the mother of learning". This means that hearing something more than once helps us keep it stored up in our memory. That must have been Peter's understanding as he wrote in 2 Peter 1:12, *for this reason I will not be negligent to remind you always of these things.* With that concept in mind, I continue the specific challenge to us as God's people in the body of Christ here at the East Jackson Church of Christ to take the "one another" principles that we have been studying from "paper to practice" by being ²*our epistle written in our hearts, known and read by all men* (2 Corinthians 3:1-3).

In Lesson 11, we studied the need to **Consider One Another.**

Hebrews 10:234 teaches that our consideration of one another is for the purpose of provoking each other to love and good works. As we live in and deal with the realities of this world, it is wonderful to have a place -- the body of Christ -- where others are considerate of us and we are considerate of others. This requires that we take the time to know others more deeply, which assembling together on a regular schedule allows us to do. With tis one also, the challenge remains for each one to answer: **(1)** what did I learn and **(2)** how am I personally applying what I learned?

In Lesson 12, we focused on the need to **Greet One Another.**

Paul taught this to the church constantly (cf. Romans 16:16; 1 Thess. 5:26; 1 Cor. 16:20). The how of our greeting is not commanded, but the necessity of it is commanded. We must have a "happy to see you" demeanor and action that is holy in expression. Again: **(1)** what did I learn and **(2)** how am I personally applying what I learned?

In Lesson 13, the study was about some **"Do Nots" In Our One Anothers**

Do not unjustly and unlovingly judge one another, Matt. 7:1-5; Rom. 14:13. Do not bite and devour one another, Galatians 5:15, through ongoing conflict. Do not provoke one another in a mode of irritating sarcastic, slanderous remarks ((Gal. 5:26). And do not hate one another by way of attitude or inaction. Love is our badge of honor (Titus 3:3; 1 John 3:15-20). As you reflect on these teachings, reflect on these questions: **(1)** what did I learn and **(2)** how am I personally applying what I learned?
